

The Holiday Golf Group (HGG) Scholarship Information

The Holiday Golf Group is a Northern California Golf Association (NCGA) associate golf club that was established in 1988. We have up to 150 members, men and woman of all levels of ability. Throughout the year we raise money for our Educational/Scholarship Fund that benefits organizations like the Lake Chabot Junior Golf Academy, Kennedy High School, Bay Area youth groups and college bound students throughout the Greater Bay Area. We feel that it is very important to support the youth of our communities in their efforts to learn the game of golf and pursue higher education.

Each year the HGG award scholarships to eligible college-bound seniors or first year college students pursuing undergraduate study at accredited two and four year institutions. The HGG will award four (4) \$1,000 (one thousand-dollar) scholarships for the 2007 academic year. Applications are now being accepted. Following is the criteria for the HGG Scholarship program:

AWARDS CRITERIA

HGG Scholarships are based on merit. Consideration is given to academic performance and future potential as determined by:

- Grade point average, rank in class and test scores (ACT/PSAT and/or SAT1)
- Participation in academic-related activities to demonstrate critical thinking and applied knowledge (science fairs, math teams, debate tournaments, etc)
- Work experience, community activities and volunteer work

APPLICATION PROCESS

- The HGG **will not** accept faxed or emailed applications.
- The HGG will not accept transcripts faxed, emailed or online. Only official transcripts will be accepted.
- Applications must be typed
- Applicant must submit two letters of recommendation with application
- Submit a recent 3x5 photo of yourself

All requested information must accompany the application. Any application received that does not have all material requested will not be considered. Please mail in 8 x 11 envelope. Do not fold application material.

Scholarships are awarded in two \$500 lump sum payments directly to the student. To receive funds student **must** provide proof of school attendance by submitting no later than September 30, 2007 an **official transcript** of enrollment & attendance. The student must submit a written letter of their progress and official transcript following the first semesters' end. Student must maintain a grade point average of 2.5 or above to qualify for the second semester lump sum payment. Students dropping below this grade point average will result in termination of their remaining award.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

To apply for this scholarship, applicants must meet the following requirements:

- Live and attend a public or private high school in the Greater Bay Area (North to Sacramento and South to San Jose).
- Have a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.5 on a 4.0 scale.
- Be a high school senior who plans to enroll in a full-time undergraduate course of study at an accredited two or four-year College or university in the fall of 2007.
- Be a first or second year college student continuing undergraduate study at an accredited two or four-year college or university in the fall of 2007.
- Be nominated by a HGG Member or Non-Member (Counselor, Teacher, School Coach)

Finalist will be notified and scheduled for an interview with the Scholarship Committee during the month of August. The finalist should come prepared to discuss their statements/summaries. Final selections will be made by September 1, 2007 and the recipients notified.

Scholarship awards will be presented at our Scholarship Invitational & Banquet in October. If the recipient is away at school and cannot be present to accept, his/her parent or guardian must be present to accept.
